'When can DNA test be ordered to ascertain paternity of child?'

(Aparna Ajinkya Firodia Versus Ajinkya Arun Firodia¹, 2023)

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in the present SLP² on power to order 'DNA Test' held that the Children have the right not to have their legitimacy questioned frivolously before a Court of Law.

HOLDINGS OF HON'BLE COURT:

- DNA testing to be ordered for children born during the continuance of a legitimate marriage, only where there is sufficient prima facie evidence to dislodge the presumption under Section 112³ of the Evidence Act.
- It is also not prudent to draw an adverse inference under section 114⁴ of the Evidence Act, in every case where a parent refuses to subject the child to a DNA
- The Court also summarized Principles of DNA Tests as:
 - > DNA profiling is to be directed in matrimonial disputes involving allegations of infidelity, only in matters where there is no other mode of proving such assertions.
 - A Court would not be justified in mechanically directing a DNA test of a child, in a case where the paternity of a child is not directly in issue, but is merely collateral to the proceeding.
 - > Only in exceptional and deserving cases, where such a test becomes indispensable to resolve the controversy, the Court can direct such test.
 - While directing DNA tests as a means to prove adultery, the Court is to be mindful of the consequences thereof on the children born out of adultery, including inheritance-related consequences, social stigma, etc.
