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# **KEY FEATURES OF UNION BUDGET: 2023-24**

The Union Budget 2023-24 opted 7 Priorities, also to be called as "Saptarishi".

- 1. Inclusive Development
- 2. Reaching the last mile
- 3. Infrastructure and Investment
- 4. Unleashing the Potential
- 5. Green growth
- 6. Youth power
- 7. Financial sector

#### 1. <u>Inclusive Development</u>:

It concentrated on the following sectors:

## 1.1 Education and Skilling:

- Creation of a national digital library for kids and teenagers.
- Redesigned Teacher Training through District Institutes of Education and Training.
- States will be urged to establish physical libraries at the ward and panchayat levels.

#### **1.2 Agriculture and Cooperatives:**

- Creating an agriculture accelerator fund to support creative start-ups in rural areas.
- Providing the animal husbandry, dairy and fishing industries with a credit line of Rs. 20 lakh crore.
- The Atmanirbhar Horticulture Clean Plant Program's to be launched.
- Making India a Global Millets Hub: "Sree Anna"

## 1.3 Health:

- Launch of the Sicle Cell Anaemia Elimination Mission.
- Establishment of 157 New Nursing College



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• Promotion of Joint Public and Private Medical Research through Selected ICMR<sup>1</sup> Labs.

#### **1.4 Inclusive Development Achievemnets:**

- 9 crore rural homes have access to drinking water.
- Over 11.4 crore farmers have received cash transfers totaling Rs. 2.2 lakh crore through PM-KISAN.
- 44.6 crore people have insurance benefits through PMSBY<sup>2</sup> and PMJJY<sup>3</sup>
- Bank accounts for PM Jan Dhan total 47.8 crore.
- 102 crore people received 220 crore Covid vaccines.
- 9.6 billion LPG installations through Ujjawala.

## 2. <u>Reaching the Last Mile</u>:

- The launch of the Pradhan Mantri PVTG<sup>4</sup> Development Mission.
- Karnataka will receive financial aid for long-term micro irrigation in areas prone to drought.
- For the 740 Eklavaya Model Residential Schools, more instructors will be hired.
- The digitalization of historic inscriptions will be set up at Bharat (SHRI)<sup>5</sup>.

## 3. Infrastructure and Investment:

- Capital investment outlay increased by 33.4% to Rs. 10 lakh crore.
- Extending the 50-year interest-free loan to state governments to encourage infrastructure investment.
- The Railways highest-ever capital spending of Rs. 2.4 lakh crore.
- 100 transportation infrastructure projects for end-to-end connectivity in the ports, coal, steel, and fertiliser industries have been identified.
- Building urban infrastructure in Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities through the formation of UIFD<sup>6</sup>.

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#### 4. Unleashing the Potential-Trust Based Governance.

- The establishment of three specialist AI<sup>7</sup> centres at educational institutions.
- The introduction of the National Data Governance Policy.
- The beginning of E-Courts Phase 3.
- Entity Digi Locker will be configured for usage by corporate entities and non-profit trusts.
- The construction of 100 labs for the development of applications based on 5G services.
- R & D<sup>8</sup> funding for the lab-grown diamonds (LGD)<sup>9</sup> industry.

#### 5. Green Growth:

- The launch of PM-PRANAM<sup>10</sup> will encourage the use of alternative fertilisers.
- 500 new "Waste to Wealth" facilities will be built to boost the local economy.
- Establishing 10,000 bio-input resource centres to assist farmers in shifting to natural farming.
- The EPA<sup>11</sup> will notify the Green Credit Programme in order to encourage sustainable behaviour.

## 6. Youth Power:

- $PMKVY^{12}$  4.0 will be launched.
- Unity Malls to be set up at States.

## 7. <u>Financial Sector</u>:

- National Financial Information Registry to be set up.
- Central Data Processing Centre to be set up.
- Credit Guarantee Scheme for MSME<sup>13</sup>.

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- Enhanced maximum deposit limit for senior citizens savings scheme from Rs. 15 lakh to Rs. 30 lakh.
- To promote business activities in GIFT IFSC<sup>14</sup>.

#### **Other Initiatives:**

#### 1. For Fiscal Management:

- 50 year Interest Free Loans to States.
- Fiscal Deficit of 3.5% of GSDP<sup>15</sup> allowed for States.

#### 2. Income Tax

- An individual with annual income of Rs 9 lakh will have to pay only Rs 45,000 in taxes.
- Income of Rs 15 lakh will fetch Rs 1.5 lakh tax, down from Rs 1.87 lakh.
- A Rs 50,000 standard deduction to tax-payers has been introduced under the new regime.
- Payment received from Agniveer Corpus Fund by Agniveers to be exempted.
- Tax exemption removed in insurance policies with premium over Rs 5 lakh.
- A higher limit of Rs 3 crore for TDS<sup>16</sup> on cash withdrawal to be provided to co-operative societies.

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#### 3. Railways:

- An outlay of Rs 2.4 lakh crore provided for railways in  $FY^{18}24$ .
- It's the highest ever allocation for Railways and is nearly nine times over FY14 allocations.
- The allocation for track renewal has been increased from Rs 15,388.05 crore in RE<sup>19</sup> 2022-23 to Rs 17,296.84 crore this year.
- The Railways is likely to roll out 75 Vande Bharat trains by August 2023.

#### 4. Defence Budget:

- Defence budget increased to Rs 5.94 lakh crore from last year's Rs 5.25 lakh crore.
- Rs 1.62 lakh crore set aside for capital expenditure including purchases of new weapons, aircraft, warships and other military hardware.
- For 2022-23, the budgetary allocation for capital outlay was Rs 1.52 lakh crore.
- Capital budget of the Border Roads Organisation increased to Rs 5,000 crore. Capital outlay for the Indian Air Force was the highest at Rs. 57,137.09 crore.

#### 5. Gems and Jewellery:

- To encourage the indigenous production of lab-grown diamonds, a research and development grant is to be provided to one of the IITs for five years.
- Proposal to review customs duty of lab-grown diamonds to be included in Part-B of Budget document.
